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President's Message

To the nearly 55 new members we have gained over the past two years and to all the veterans who have been in Rondout for some time, welcome to the 2021-2022 school year! Also, welcome to our members in three brand new positions created by the RVF: a greenhouse technician in the clerical unit, an athletic trainer in the teachers unit, and school monitors in our paraprofessionals unit.

I know this has been a long stretch for all of us. I'm sure we all had high hopes over the summer of a return to normalcy this year. And then the Delta variant reared its ugly head, upheaving our hopes and expectations. I know this marks the second challenging year in a row, and I know you are all exhausted and overwhelmed. Honestly . . . I am too. I know how you all feel.

But what I have seen over the past year and a half can't be described by words like "overwhelmed" and "exhaustion." I label what I have seen from all of you with words like "dedication," "courage," and "perseverance." I know you never signed up to be a hero. But you all are just that. Continuing to selflessly educate America's youth through a pandemic . . . frankly, it's remarkably heroic.

Your RVF union has also been continuing to work, despite the state of the world around us. During the heart of the pandemic in the spring of 2020, many of you helped us deliver food for both the district as well as the local food pantry. You stood by me at the food pantry, stocking shelves and taking in deliveries. And at that time, none of us really knew much about the virus, and the vaccine was not available yet. But you still showed up. You volunteered at the vaccination clinics we held as a district last year in the high school gym. We recently collected over one thousand cans of food for those in need, and last year we collected socks for the homeless. We have maintained our agreement with Ulster County by continuing our Adopt-a-Highway program, holding two highway cleanups per year. And for two years in a row, we delivered senior surprise signs to every senior's front lawn.

At the high school, we helped the principal construct outdoor classrooms for the students. At the elementary level, we have worked with the district to try and address the bus driver shortage we face, and we successfully lobbied the district to add an additional kindergarten class in order to lower kindergarten class size numbers. At the junior high, we negotiated with the district to remove the student "pods," where teachers had to move rooms every

period. And we contributed free ice cream vouchers for our 2021 IS/JHS graduates. At the district office, we have advocated for additional security measures for our members who work at the entrance of the building and collect large sums of cash. This November, we will be continuing our tradition of celebrating SRP day by presenting each SRP with a token of our appreciation.



You all helped contribute to these

achievements, while you simultaneously have your own busy lives at home and your students here at school. It's extraordinary.

I want to encourage you all to stay engaged with each other. A union is only as strong as the relationships we have with each other. Attend your building meetings. Show up to a highway cleanup. Come to unwind at the retirement dinner and other RVF gatherings. It is important that we have these interactions with each other outside of a busy school day.

This year, we will be negotiating two separate contracts. Both the Paraprofessionals' contract and the Teachers' contract expire in June of 2022. We will work hard to get a fair deal. All your RVF Executive Committee needs from all of you is to never give up. Lean on each other when you need to, and get to know some of your colleagues outside of work. Friendship and comradery is what binds us together more than our profession alone does. Keep pushing forward, and we will get through this together. At times, you may feel overwhelmed, but from where I stand, all I can see is perseverance.


