Hold the popcorn—Hollywood may be walking out. Television and movie writers have given union leaders the right to call for a walkout, with an overwhelming number also supporting a strike if the Writers Guild of America is unable to settle their contract by the upcoming May 1 deadline.

Solidarity win: 21% over three years is what Los Angeles

Unified School District has agreed to pay its nearly 35,000 teachers. This comes on the heels of another settlement with its 30,000 support staff. Both teachers and staff staged a three-day walk out last month that advanced negotiations for both unions.

Free Cone Day was back after a four-year hiatus, and Ben and Jerry's flagship ice cream store in Vermont has filed for a union election. Scoopers United would be the first unionized store putting the company's progressive ideals to the test.
