





FIX TIER 6 CAMPAIGN

We have much work to do to make public service retirement fair for everyone. Whether you are a retiree or are currently in Tiers 4, 5 or 6, we need you <u>to get involved</u>.

VOTE-COPE ACTION

VOTE-COPE is the political action arm of NYSUT. Most recently, these monies were used to help enact legislation which requires public schools in New York to develop and execute programs to prevent workplace violence. VOTE-COPE contributions can be used to tackle the "Fix Tier 6" campaign and have helped pass the one-time 55/25 retirement incentive about a decade ago. In addition, up to 40% of our VOTE-COPE contributions can be funneled directly back to the RVF for our own local political action items, such as school board elections and budget votes. Please consider giving just \$1-2 per paycheck. If you already donate to VOTE-COPE,
